

**EVENT BROCHURE
HIGH PLAINS SCOUT POWWOW 2010**

April 30 – May 2, 2010

PRE-REGISTRATION: Due to the technical aspects of this merit badge conference, pre-registration is required.

Note: Webelos scouts are encouraged to attend! Webelos activity badges are being offered.

Registration fee is \$15 scout or adult leader.

PLEASE REGISTER BY APRIL 9 TO ATTEND: (We need to obtain counts for noon meal on Saturday & schedule merit badge classes.)

MERIT BADGE CLASSES: Each Merit Badge is listed with the times offered and pre-class requirements.

REGISTRATION: Registration is much easier if done by unit.

- Please list the Scoutmaster or Powwow leader responsible for registration. Registration confirmation and other information will be sent to this person.
- Select the desired merit badges and list them on the registration form in order of preference.
- Select second choices in case one of the first choices has been filled.
- Mail with the proper fees. A confirmation will be sent to the Scoutmaster or Powwow Leader within a week of receipt. When registration confirmation is received, scouts should begin pre-class work. ***All registration fees must be received two weeks after classes have been confirmed or the class spots will be reopened and made available to other scouts/troops.
- Please advise at time of registration of any special needs camping requirements.

CANCELLATION POLICY: Cancellations on or before April 2 will receive full refund. From April 3 to April 21, one-half refund. No refunds on or after April 22.

PARTICIPATION:

- Each participant will receive a specially designed patch.
- Participants should bring merit badge book, notepaper and writing utensils with them to each class. **EACH SCOUT SHOULD BRING TO CLASS ANY PRE-REQUISITE ITEMS FOR EACH COURSE.** Hand pre-requisite information in Friday evening at check-in at Cultural Arts Center. This information will be placed in a folder and placed in scout packet & returned to scout. Scouts will need to take their packets with them to the merit badge classes.
Being prepared causes fewer incomplete Merit Badges.
- We ask each troop to designate an adult leader to provide assistance to the Powwow on Saturday. Many of the Powwow committee members are also merit badge counselors; all help is greatly appreciated.

EQUIPMENT:

- Scouts and Units should furnish normal camping gear, including tents, food and camp stove. *Campfires will be allowed with fire rings.*
- Extra spending money would be helpful for restaurants and campus activities, bookstore, and videos.

LEADERSHIP: Fee \$15. Units are expected to follow all scouting requirements for two-deep leadership for this Powwow. Leaders are expected to provide supervision of their units. Discipline and good behavior will be the responsibility of the leaders. Leaders should note the section on Leadership Training. The leaders are invited to participate in the sessions. Pre registration and fees are noted on those special training sessions. Please pre register for adult training sessions. Leaders are welcome to attend Merit Badge classes for observation as room permits.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING: SATURDAY

UNIFORM: Scouts and leaders should wear their uniforms during the Powwow. The BSA uniform shirt will help identify scouts on campus.

HEADQUARTERS: Cultural Arts Center Lobby

FIRST AID: First aid assistance may be obtained at Headquarters located in Cultural Arts Center Lobby.

ACTIVITIES: Pool tables are available in the Union area. There are pop and candy machines in this area. Scout leaders should supervise and participate with their scouts in this area. Remember, we are guests of the college, please act accordingly.

SWIMMING WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THE COLLEGE INDOOR POOL ON SATURDAY, MAY 1ST FROM 4P.M. TO 6P.M.

ORIENTATION

Colby Community College is located on the southeast corner of College Drive and Range Avenue. From exit #53 on I-70, go north to this intersection and turn to the east. Follow the signs.

In merit badge sessions scouts will receive pertinent technical information. If the prerequisite work is completed and presented at class the scout should be able to complete the requirements. If the scout attends class even though the prerequisite work is not done he will receive credit for the class work. The remaining work may be completed at home with minimal effort on the part of the unit advancement committee chairperson or the scoutmaster.

Merit Badge Sheets: Each scout will receive a personalized Powwow merit badge sheet. These will have the room number and time of class session printed on each sheet. Please see that the scouts attend the assigned class at the right time in the right

room. These sheets are used for taking attendance at the proper class. The instructor or assistant will keep the sheets. It is most helpful if the sheets are physically attached to the prerequisite work. They should not be returned to the scouts. The sheets will be returned to the Scoutmaster at the Awards Ceremony Saturday evening.

Each scout is expected already to have the appropriate merit badge books and the preliminary work completed prior to attending the Powwow. All preliminary work will be placed in the scout packet at check-in. The scout will take the packet with him to the merit badge class.

Camping will be on the campus of Colby Community College. Low impact practices are required. Water will be available. Units may cook on campfires with fire rings or camp stoves. A wide variety of fast food chains and restaurants are available.
