PAST

In 1919, Cleyson L. Brown gave 150 acres of the Brown Memorial Park to the Boy Scouts of America, so that Scouting could grow in Dickinson County. Since 1927, the camp has expanded and provided thousands of youth the opportunity to experience the adventures of camping.

PRESENT

More than \$450,000 has been spent on new facilities and other camp improvements since 2003. Improvements include: heated rest-rooms & shower house, storm shelter, climbing tower, Eagle Scout Pavilion, 16 Adirondacks with bunk beds. Camp Brown is available for organizations or groups to rent.

Robert K. Weary Climbing Tower

Instructors are provided or your group can send leaders to BSA training. Bouldering, climbing, rappelling and free rappelling programs offered.



Eagle Scout Pavilion

A great training facility with 12 picnic tables, refrigerators and bar-b-que grill



FACILITIES

Dining Hall: Equipped with a kitchen, tables, chairs and ceiling fans. Capacity 200 people.

Adirondack Sleeping Shelters: Three-sided log structures with four built-in bunks. Mattresses are provided along with a tarp to cover the open side. There are two Adirondack villages each with 8 cabins and program shelter.

Shelters: Two activity shelters with picnic tables and concrete floors.

Camp sites: Five total campsites are within walking distance of the dining hall and hold up to 40 people each. Tents not provided.

Health Lodge- Small building with one sleeping room, bathroom and air conditioning. First aide supplies are not provided.

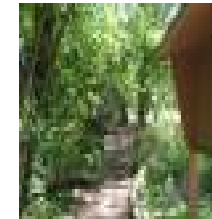
Swimming Pool: A shower house with changing areas. Ask about availability.
